One in four Cambridge Undergraduates receives a Cambridge Bursary.



We know that money will be on your mind when you're thinking about university.

The University of Cambridge provides financial support to help ease the stress that being on a tight budget can put you under.


We offer grants (known as bursaries) of up to £3,500 per year, or £5,600 if you're an independent student*.

You don't ever have to pay this money back.

If your household income is less than £62,215, you'll receive a Cambridge Bursary, if it's less than £25,000, you'll receive the maximum. There's also the Education Premium – an extra £1,000 per year if you were eligible for Free School Meals.

You don't need to apply separately for the Cambridge Bursary, you're assessed when you apply for your Ioan from Student Finance and, once approved, the money goes straight into your bank account.

It could help ease financial pressure on you and your family and help you focus on your studies, without worrying about money.
